



## Birth certificates -

include: being the child of a particular parent or parents (filiation)





#### **BIRTH CERTIFICATES...** FROM THE PERSPECTIVE OF A CHILD



An official document issued to record a person's birth and identify them by name, place, date of birth, and **parentage** (identity and origins of the [legal] parents). It proves that birth registration has occurred (legal identity).

It is an official identification for basic transactions: opening a bank account, registering to vote, getting a passport, entering the formal job market etc. It provides for **general protection** (from violence, trafficking etc.), access to social services, health care, justice.

It helps to ensure that children's rights are upheld (identity, name, registration, maintaining contacts to both of its "parents" etc.)





#### KEY FACTS Rainbow Europe 2022 (ILGA), Family Rights Country Ranking

#### ILGA-Europe – Rainbow Map 2022\*:

#### LGBTIQ\* PARTNERSHIP RIGHTS...

- Marriage equality in 18 European countries (14 EU), most recently in Switzerland (2021/22), Andorra and Slovenia (2022). Campaigns i.e. in Czechia and Estonia
- 24 (26) countries with registered partnerships. Monaco is mentioned with "cohabitation" (December 2019), most recently Montenegro (2020), new efforts i.e. in Lithuania, Romanian couples at the ECtHR
- Constitutional Limitations in 18 (19) European countries (9 EU). In Russia since July 2020.
- NO RECOGNITION IN... Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Bulgaria, Romania, Slovakia






#### ILGA-Europe – Rainbow Map 2022\*:


LGBTIQ\* PARENTHOOD RIGHTS....

- Joint adoption in 19 countries (15 tU) (marriage equality countries). Croatia de facto since May 2022, Switzerland since 1st of July 2022, Slovenia most recently since October 2022.
- Second-parent adoption in 20 (21) countries (14 [15] EU). New are Estonia, Liechtenstein (2022), not mentioned is Croatia (Life Partnership Act). Possibilities in Italy (single court decisions) and Ireland (guardianship).
- NO RECOGNITION in 10 EU countries: Bulgaria, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Greece, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Romania, Poland, Slovakia.




ILGA-Europe – Rainbow Map 2022\*: LGBTIQ\* PARENTHOOD RIGHTS...

- More and more direct co-parent recognition - in 15 countries (12 EU) [ILGA still says 10 countries (8 EU)].
- New in France (2021), Ireland with new possibilities since May 2020.
   Sweden with parenthood (marital) presumption since 2021. Outside of the EU: Switzerland since 1 July 2022 (but not after treatment abroad).
- Mostly after (IVF) treatment in a clinic (i.e. Austria), or through marital presumption (i.e. Malta, Slovenia), incl. home insemination in Spain, Denmark, decided in February 2022, Austria since August 2022).



TGEU - Transgender Rights Map 2022 (and ILGA): LGBTIQ\* PARENTHOOD RIGHTS...


- Trans parenthood: 5 (4 EU) countries recognise the gender identity of trans parents within binary options. Belgium, Sweden, Malta, Slovenia, Iceland
- Malta and new (non-EU) Iceland recognise non-binary parents as well



#### ADDITIONAL FAMILY COMPOSITIONS

LGBTIQ\* PARENTHOOD RIGHTS (not covered by ILGA)

Foster care: 18 EU countries allow same-sex couples to become foster parents, prohibition/limitation in 8 Member States, Slovenia allows single LGBTIQ<sup>®</sup> people to foster. In Hungary, a new law requires a political decision (2021). In Poland, it is de facto not allowed (personal relationships will be examined). Austria: no possibilities in Niederösterreich, Italy: partly allowed.



#### ADDITIONAL FAMILY COMPOSITIONS

LGBTIQ\* PARENTHOOD RIGHTS (not covered by ILGA)

 (Legal) multi-parenting is not possible in Europe so far. England and Wales offer "parental responsibility" for co-partners. In the Netherlands, a new law is expected, in Germany the coalition plans a legislative proposal. In Sweden and Finland, multiparenting was at least discussed. In France, a court just decided on parental responsibility for four persons (Jan. 22). In Denmark, parental leave will be possible for non-legal parents (2022).



#### ADDITIONAL FAMILY COMPOSITIONS

LGBTIQ\* PARENTHOOD RIGHTS (not covered by ILGA)

 Altruistic surrogacy (for same-sex couples) is regulated in UK, not forbidden in Belgium and the Netherlands (law expected in 2022), in Greece theoretically open to single (LGBTIQ\*) women. Recognition of intended parents (arrangements abroad, i.e. USA, Canada) adviced by ECtHR 2019 (direct recognition of birth certificates, court decisions or adoption).



#### COMMON SCENARIOS... CASE TWO



REGISTRATION OF A FAMILY IN A HOST MEMBER STATE (incl. CITIZENSHIP) A birth certificate (adoption document) will be presented (i.e. embassy, national authorties)

Indicated (legal) comotherhood or co-fatherhood might be not accepted The "invalid" document might stop the procedure. Possibly, there will be a partial recognition.

RESULT: The child loses legal ties (to the nonbiological parent with all consequences)

## Freedom of movement?

In December 2021, the case clarified that Member States must ensure free movement parents. If a Member State recognises a filiation (here: Spain), others should (for example) issue an identity card or passport on the basis of the foreign birth certificate (here: Bulgaria). The decision also clarified that children in rainbow families are indeed "direct descendants". However, a range of questions remain. Read





## **Obstacles to the free movement**

For same-sex marriages, the study by Tryfonidou/Wintemute in 2021 revealed that...


- 15 countries would accept marriages from abroad (but at least one country doesn't)
- 6 countries would downgrade
  marriages to civil partnerships
- at least 6 countries would only give residence permits (but 2 countries do not...)



## **Obstacles to the free movement**

For same-sex civil unions, the study by Tryfonidou/Wintemute in 2021 revealed that...


- 15 (18) countries would accept unions from abroad (but two countries don't)
- 8 countries would downgrade civil unions to a "durable relationship"
- 1 country would recognise
  unions for residence permits



## **Obstacles to the free movement**

For rainbow families with children, the study says... not too much (...)

- 8 countries promise equal treatment for children (Poland, Austria, Cyprus, Ireland, Estonia, Finland, Slovenia and Spain)
- 2 countries (Greece and Slovakia) would only accept one (biological) parent
- 2 countries (Romania and Croatia) won't allow joint parenthood
- 1 country (Sweden) admits recognition problems in cases

## **OPTION TWO...**

THE EU elaborates an instrument to enable the mutual recognition of parenthood/filiation... without changing national provisions!

Due to differences in national legislations across Member States, family ties may not always be recognised when rainbow families cross the EU's internal borders. The Commission will bring forward a legislative initiative on the mutual recognition of parenthood and explore possible measures to support the mutual recognition of same-gender partnership between Member States


PILLAR THREE OF THE LGBTI EQUALITY STRATEGY: PROTECTING RIGHTS OF RAINBOW FAMILIES

#### NELFA'S SUPPORT....

1. SUCH AN EU-WIDE VALID INSTRUMENT WILL HELP TO AVOID THE NON-RECOGNICTION OF BIRTH CERTIFICATES (LEGAL PARENTHOOD/FILIATION) PER SE

5. WE WOULD LIKE TO SEE THAT CHILDREN'S RIGHTS AND THEIR BEST INTERESTS ALWAYS WILL BE CONSIDERED IN THE FIRST PLACE (BEFORE LGBTIQ\* ISSUES AND POSSIBLE PREJUDICES...)

4. WE WOULD LIKE TO SEE THAT SUCH AN INSTRUMENT WILL BE NOT ONLY FOR "TRAVEL DOCUMENTS/RESIDENCE" BUT FOR ALL OTHER LEGAL PURPOSES AS WELL. FOR US, FREE MOVEMENT IS ABOUT THE RECOGNITION OF A FAMILY AS SUCH.



2. IT ENABLES CIVIL SERVANTS TO REGISTER CHILDREN (I.E. FOR THE PURPOSE OF OBTAINING CITIZENSHIP OR ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE BEYOND OTHER QUESTIONS)

3. WE WOULD LIKE TO SEE AN IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ECJ JUGDMENTS (BABY SARA -BULGARIA NEEDS TO ISSUE A BIRTH CERTIFICATE WITH TWO MOTHERS. AND COMAN!)
